Dear Christian Friends,

Joel Barker, whose work on the power of vision has shaped and prospered both business and the church has said:

*"You can and should shape your own future;
Because, if you don't, somebody else surely will!"*

These are wise words to consider when presented with the gift of a new 2017 year. Joel (the prophet not Barker!) speaks of "old men dreaming dreams and young men seeing visions" (Joel 2:28) We must, with Christ our Lord, shape our future to be a faithful church in 2017.

Let me share with you that your elders and deacons understand this well. They are dreaming dreams. They are not simply in a "holding pattern", but are using this

Other vision issues focus on the care of members, following up on visitors, mission to the community and maintenance/repair of the buildings. All these are strengths that look toward the calling of a new full-time pastor. And, by the way, your Pastor Nominating committee is working hard and meeting weekly to find God's candidate.

Also, on a small celebrative note, the church's telephones, struck by lightning several months back, will be repaired next week with a gift from an anonymous donor. Yea! Now one can call the church and get the church's voicemail, or me, or Milla. Communication restored. Amen.

And this vision is shared. When you come to worship you see *many* new faces, and many more long-time members' faces. The pews are filling up, the choir and Brandon are leading us in creative, exuberant music, and we've renewed our lay liturgists (who are doing a terrific job on Sundays!). Which tells me, EVERYONE at HSCPC has an eye to the future. Everyone at HSCPC is faithfully shaping the future of the church. That is love in action.

And so let's *all of us* continue setting the church's DNA for the future. Friends, it is so much fun to be your Temporary Supply Pastor!
