I want to begin by saying how thankful I am for your wonderfully warm reception this past Sunday. You know how to make the new guy feel right at home. I too am excited about the future of our ministry together.

The last move I made was seven years ago, July of 2011, when I moved from Summerville, GA to Belton, SC. In worship this Sunday we will be celebrating the Lord's Supper together. I invite you to join me in preparing to receive this sacrament through prayer and meditation on the scripture.

THE SEARCH CONTINUES FOR A NEW MUSIC DIRECTOR

The permanent position of Music Director is a part time position averaging approximately 15 hours per week spent in preparation for and performance in worship services. Capability at the organ is required. The position includes directing choir, supervising the maintenance of church musical instruments,

maintaining the music library, securing guest musicians as approved by the Worship/Music committee and Pastor, securing the service of a substitute organist/pianist as necessary, and being available to provide music for weddings, funerals, etc.

Currently there are a couple of candidates for this position. One has been interviewed by the search committee, and another will be meeting with them soon. The search committee continues to welcome and respond to all inquiries about the position.
